1. RMC Research's and AIR's OESE Comprehensive Center Applications (Bob Harmon)

RMC Research: Robin Jarvis is working on a proposal to ED to provide comprehensive center services to selected states (see cover letter). RMC is seeking a collaborating partnership with NAESPA (see MOU). This item was discussed by the Board in April and was referred to the Communications Outreach Committee for further consideration and a recommendation to the Board for action in May. Official deadline for the OESE competition is May 24; RMC is targeting May 22 as its internal deadline. <u>RMC Cover Letter</u>; <u>MOU</u>; and <u>DRAFT Letter of Support</u>

AIR: Veronica Tate from the American Institutes of Research (AIR) has approached the NAESPA Board, requesting a letter of support for their application to OESE to serve in various capacities as a Comprehensive Center. Because there was not sufficient time to bring this second request to the Communications Outreach Committee, a conference call was held with Veronica, Sonya, Marcus, and Bob. <u>AIR</u> <u>DRAFT Letter of Support</u>

Board Poll: In the interest of fairness, draft letters of support were provided by both organizations. The Board and Committee leaders were polled as to the desire to sign and issue the letters of support for RMC and AIR to accompany their OESE applications. The poll results were mixed.
