

# **Conference Update**

## **Attendance**

A total of 2,950 attendees registered for this year's conference as of January 26, almost exactly the same as last year. These numbers do not include exhibitors. Participants include:

- 283 Distinguished School Attendees
  - 185 Presenters
- 35 U.S. Education Department Staff
- 2,447 General Attendees

#### **Exhibitors**

137 companies purchased 180 exhibit booths this year, representing a 12% decline from last year. Many education conferences are experiencing a similar decline in the number of booths sold this year, but we are conducting an exhibitor evaluation to learn as much as possible about the decline and how to reverse it. All NASTID members should visit exhibitors and thank them for their participation; these personal connections do make a difference for retaining exhibit participation.

#### Food

Once again, food service is included in the Exhibit Hall to help drive traffic and provide attendees with onsite breakfast, lunch and snack choices. The conference heavily subsidizes the cost of healthy food options to allow attendees to stay within their travel budgets.

Thurs 3:45 PM	How We Learn – Ben Carey is an award-winning New York Times science reporter. He'll share surprising findings from his recent book about the "how" of learning.
Fri 10:00 AM	<u>Lessons from the School with No Name</u> – Stacey Bess shares her story about teaching homeless children in a small shed, known as the "School With No Name."
Sat 3:30 PM	<u>Disruptive Demographics: Implications for K-12 Education</u> – University of North Carolina professor, and economics expert, James Johnson, talks about the challenges and opportunities for U.S. education based on our changing demographics.
Sun 8:30 AM	<u>The Teacher Wars: Lessons from History for Improving Teaching Today</u> – Journalist Dana Goldstein shares the findings of her recent book, The Teacher Wars. This

keynote is followed by four sessions focused on improving the teaching profession.
