Meeting Agenda:

- 1. Association's support of Title II funding <u>Letter to Congress</u> (Jonas Zuckerman Co-chair)
 - The letter was approved by the board, signed by the Association President and sent to staff members of Congressional leaders on September 18.

2. Government Relations Update (Kelly Christiansen, Brustein & Manasevit)

- I. Congressional updates
 - a. Appropriations/debt ceiling updates
 - i. House budget
 - 1. Passed out of Committee in July
 - 2. Debate and vote on House floor last week
 - 3. Calls for significant cuts to mandatory spending over the next 10 years, but language is not binding
 - 1. Main purpose of this budget is to serve as a vehicle to push through tax reform
 - ii. Senate budget
 - Senate Budget Committee to mark up its budget resolution on 10/5
 - iii. After House and Senate have passed their own budgets, lawmakers will go to conference to hammer out differences
 - b. Agenda for remainder of the year
 - i. Disaster relief
 - 1. Legislation expected next week for areas affected by Hurricane Maria
 - ii. Tax proposal?
 - 1. GOP focus on passing tax reform after failed attempts to repeal Affordable Care Act
 - 2. So far, tax proposals silent on tax-credit for school choice (i.e. "florida model" of tax-deductible voucher fund)
 - Potential for changes to State/local tax revenues if federal tax credit is eliminated (would put downward pressure on States/municipalities to lower rates to keep overall tax burden down)
 - iii. DACA?
 - 1. Both Democrats and Republicans hoping to extend the program



- 1. Potential areas of debate: border security, President's border wall request
- iv. Appropriations/debt ceiling
 - 1. Continuing resolution/debt ceiling deal expire on Dec. 8th setting up for "cliffmas"
- II. Administration Updates
 - a. ESSA State plan approval process
 - i. Most of remaining States submitted plans on 9/18
 - 1. Handful received extensions due to Hurricanes
 - 2. 14 States and D.C. have been approved; only Colorado and Michigan awaiting approval from first batch
 - b. Title IX interim guidance
 - i. ED issued Dear Colleague letter and Q&A document on 9/22
 - 1. Rescinds the 2011 Dear Colleague letter on Title IX
 - 2. Offers interim guidance most significant change is allowing use of higher evidence standard
 - ii. ED plans to engage in rulemaking process to rewrite guidelines, which will include public comment period
 - c. New ED staff
 - i. Some momentum recently with filling positions at ED
 - ii. Nominations for Deputy Secretary and Assistant Secretaries for Planning, Evaluation, and Policy Analysis; and Career, Technical, and Adult Education
 - 1. Subject to Senate approval
 - iii. Hiring of Deputy Assistant Secretary for OCTAE and a Senior Adviser to the Secretary
