- 1. Distinguished Schools Update/Recognition Evolution Under NAESPA
  - **Distinguished Schools:** Participation numbers at the 2018 Conference (Jeri Erickson)
    - o 63 schools have been named representing 34 States
    - 34 schools are named in Category 1: Exceptional student performance for two or more consecutive years
    - 23 schools are named in Category 2: Closing the achievement gap between student groups
    - 6 schools are named in Category 3: Excellence in serving special populations of students (e.g. homeless, migrant, English learners, etc.)
    - o 303 Distinguished School attendees are confirmed to attend the conference
  - Recognition Evolution Under NAESPA: (Group Discussion)
    - The current structure can support the reorganized Association—with a few minor tweaks, such as broadening the category definitions to include all ESEA programs.
    - It is important to maintain the Title I Distinguished School distinction. Title I incorporates other programs byway of collaboration.
    - Address why some states are not participating in the Distinguished School program:
      - Some states are going to a new accountability (or assessment) system and want to have 2-3 years of data on high performing schools for the nomination process.
      - Communicate to Distinguished School Coordinators that there is flexibility for states to name schools—the years that states use for their data is up to them.
      - Stories from other states on how they honor their schools locally can help encourage more states to participate in the program.
