1. Finalize Guiding Principles Belief Statements (Bob Harmon) Draft - Version 1, Draft - Version 2

The Guiding Principles were discussed at earlier meetings, as they are part of the annual responsibilities outlined in the Strategic Plan. The discussion led to a decision by this group to draft a set of *Belief Statements* that encapsulate the *Guiding Principles*. Draft – Version 1 was created by Bob Harmon with significant assistance from Julia Martin as the first editor. It was then sent out to a subgroup of Committee volunteers for their review and further refinement. It was during that process that Jason Harmon (NY) took the initiative to rethink and streamline the *Belief Statements* into what is now called Draft – Version 2.

The recommendation of the Committee is to submit Draft – Version 2 of the Belief Statements to the Board for their review and approval. Both drafts will be available to the to the Board as a part of the background materials for the May 15th meeting.

2. Update on collaboration with other groups (Roy Stehle, Co-chair)

• Roy was just beginning to identify groups for connection and collaboration. No further action is planned at this time.

3. Government Relations Update -- Julia Martin (Brustein & Manasevit)

- I. Congressional updates
 - a. Appropriations for FY 2018
 - i. Finalized in March, but potential rescission?
 - 1. Budget and Impound Control Act of 1974
 - a. Used fairly regularly until late 1980's
 - b. Can apply to any unobligated funds
 - 2. Rescission package expected from WH shortly
 - a. Test balloon?
 - b. Moderates reluctant to relitigate
 - c. Can agreements be trusted?
 - b. Appropriations for FY 2019
 - i. Continuing to work through hearings, testimony
 - ii. Good news: already have spending caps agreed to, so partway done
 - c. Impact Aid ESA bill (Education Savings Accounts for Military Families Act, HR 5199)
 - i. Would take money out of Impact Aid to run ESAs for military families
 - 1. Amount varies depending on whether
 - a. area is "heavily impacted"
 - b. student lives on or off-base
 - ii. Opposed by a number of advocacy groups
 - iii. Supported by conservative think-tanks

- iv. House Democrats threaten to derail NDAA
- d. Farm Bill (Agriculture and Nutrition Act of 2018, H.R. 2)
 - i. Passed House Agriculture Committee 4/18, now on to House floor
 - 1. Controversy over procedure/ Rule for consideration
 - ii. Change to FFVP
 - 1. "Fresh" includes frozen, dried, and canned foods
 - iii. Changes to SNAP
 - 1. Could damage Direct Certification data
 - 2. Could discourage families from FRL
- e. Change in Congressional makeup
 - i. Retirement of Speaker Paul Ryan and 35 other House members
 - 1. Additional members running for Senate/ Governor
 - ii. Potential shift in 116th Congress just not sure which direction
- II. Administration Updates
 - a. School violence task force
 - i. Has held a couple organizational meetings and one two-part "listening session" on school discipline guidance
 - Following up on GAO report, <u>AASA survey</u> shows only 16% of school leadership say their policies changed as a result of guidance
 - b. Changes to rules on "evidence based"
 - i. Correcting error in earlier regulations immediate effect
 - ii. Reinstated selection factor: the extent to which the methods of evaluation provide valid and reliable performance data
 - iii. Removed the term "randomized control trial" from definitions used in grant competitions,
 - iv. New definition of "strong evidence" will include additional types of experimental studies in addition to randomized control trials
 - c. ED releases new Civil Rights Data Collection
 - i. Key takeaways:
 - 1. Disciplinary disparities continue
 - 2. Odd data blip surrounding integration orders due to change in definition
 - 3. Mis-reporting of rapes/sexual assault
