Policy Updates



Allowability under ESSER or GEER

In determining whether an activity is an allowable use of ESSER or GEER funds, a State or LEA must determine if the use of funds...

- Is intended to prevent, prepare for, or respond to the COVID-19 pandemic;
- Is allowable under one of the authorized uses of ESSER or GEER funds; and
- Is permissible under the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (Uniform Guidance, 2 CFR Part 200), including determining if it is necessary and reasonable for the performance of the ESSER or GEER award.



Examples of Uses of ESSER and GEER Funds

- Addressing the impact of lost instructional time through activities such as tutoring, summer learning, and afterschool programs;
- Supporting students' social, emotional, mental health and academic needs;
- Purchasing educational technology;
- Sanitization and minimizing the spread of infectious diseases, including cleaning supplies and staff training to address sanitization and minimizing the spread of infectious diseases;



Examples of Uses of ESSER and GEER Funds

- COVID testing and vaccinations (including vaccine incentives);
- Student transportation-related costs;
- HVAC/indoor air quality improvements;
- Bonuses/hazard pay for teachers and other school staff



Examples of Uses of ESSER and GEER Funds

The Department encourages States and LEAs to use ESSER and GEER funds to address:

- The educational needs of students, including the impact of lost instructional resulting from the pandemic; and
- Inequities, including focusing supports and services underserved students who have been disproportionately impacted by the pandemic.



Examples of Uses of ESSER and GEER Funds

- Grantees should keep in mind that, when using funds for other allowable activities, such as construction or capital purchases, other Federal requirements may be applicable.
- Ultimately, it is up to the State to determine if a proposed use of ESSER or GEER funds is:
 - Allowable;
 - Related to preventing, preparing for, or responding to COVID-19; and
 - Necessary and reasonable for the performance of the award.

Revised ESSER and GEER Use of Funds FAQs

- Builds on the May 2021 <u>ESSER and GEER Use of Funds</u>
 <u>FAQs</u> by incorporating into one document existing single topic FAQs and information shared in webinars, including:
 - COVID connection <u>information</u>
 - COVID-19 vaccinations and testing <u>FAQs</u> and vaccine and testing incentives <u>FAQs</u> and <u>Fact Sheet</u>
 - Use of funds for student transportation <u>FAQs</u>
 - HVAC/Construction use of funds webinar slides



Updated ESSER and GEER Use of Funds FAQs

- Includes new FAQs based on questions that have been asked by grantees
- The objective is to have one comprehensive document to assist States and LEAs with the implementation of the ESSER and GEER programs
- Projected timeline for updated FAQs is late August/early September 2022
- A webinar will accompany the release of the updated FAQs

GEER I	Sep. 30, 2022	Jan. 30, 2023	Apr. 1, 2024
GEER II	Sep. 30, 2023	Jan. 29, 2024	Mar. 31, 2025
CRRSA EANS	Sep. 30, 2023	Jan. 29, 2024	Mar. 31, 2025

- Held listening sessions with the Council of Chief State **School Officers, the Association of Latino Administrators and Superintendents, and the National Association of State Auditors, Comptrollers, and Treasurers**

Monitoring Updates



Monitoring to Date

- 10 States monitored to date
 - ESSER- IA, IN, KY, ME, and TN
 - GEER- IN, KY, ME, MT, NC, NV, OK, TX and WV
- ESSER reviews currently underway: CA, NE, OH and WI
- Spring 2022 Quarterly Review
 - 50 States, D.C., and Puerto Rico reviewed
 - State implementation of LEA ARP ESSER awards, including the LEA will use the required 20% set-aside to address the academic impact of lost instructional time



Monitoring Updates FY 2023 Monitoring Activities

- Quarterly Reviews
 - Fall of 2022 and Spring of 2023
- Consolidated and Comprehensive Monitoring
 - ESSER, ARP ESSER, GEER and EANS
 - States to be monitored will be notified in September
- Monthly Check-Ins
